The Association for Recorded Sound Collections Board of Directors invites you to attend the 49th Annual Conference at the Westin Convention Center in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, on **May 27-30, 2015**, hosted by the Carnegie Library of Pittsburgh.

Please review the entire registration packet for details on the workshops, conference program, banquet, hotel, travel, silent auction, newcomer orientation/mentor program, and exhibiting and sponsorship opportunities. Registration forms with checks or money orders made payable to ARSC must be mailed to the conference registrar by May 6, 2015 in order to receive the early registration discount. You may also register online and pay via PayPal or a credit card (a PayPal account is not required).

HOTEL

Conference sessions will be held at the Westin, a smoke-free, pet friendly hotel located in the heart of downtown Pittsburgh near shopping, restaurants, and public transportation. For distinctive local flavor, Pittsburgh's historic Strip District, named for its narrow confines between the Allegheny River and Grant's Hill, is just one mile from the hotel. Great cultural offerings found here include the famous Saturday Farmers Market, plus intriguing ethnic and specialty shopping and tempting local cuisine.

The Westin offers a complimentary shuttle around the downtown area on weekdays between 7:00am-11:00pm, as well as a business center, workout facility with lap pool, a concierge who leads daily riverfront runs from 6:30-7:00am, and a gear lending program (for \$5, workout gear, including tennis shoes, will be delivered to your room). Other guest room amenities include laptop safes, complementary wifi and newspaper, and a coffeemaker with Starbucks coffee.

Our primary contracted dates are Tuesday May 26–Saturday May 30, 2015 (with Sunday departure). ARSC group rates will be honored 3 days prior (Memorial Day weekend) and 3 days after these dates, subject to availability (if you receive an error message when booking extended dates online, please call reservation line for assistance). The deadline to make reservations at the Westin is **May 5, 2015, 5:00 pm**, **EDT**. Reservations made after this date will be on a space available basis at the prevailing rate.

To make your hotel reservations please follow these instructions:

- By telephone: call (412) 560-6365 and request the Association for Recorded Sound Collections room block. Reservations must be guaranteed with first night's deposit to a credit card.
- Online: follow the links on the ARSC conference page, or go to our Westin group page at http://tinyurl.com/q22qv4r. Adjust dates accordingly and select room preferences.

The ARSC rate is \$139 (plus 14% tax) for a standard room with one king or two double beds, single or double occupancy (add \$10 for each additional person; complimentary rollaway beds may be requested for king rooms). Check-in is 3:00 p.m. EDT, check-out is noon. Reservations must be cancelled by 6:00 p.m. EDT on the day *prior* to your arrival date to avoid loss of first night's room and tax charges.

TRAVEL (see conference website for additional maps and links)

The Pittsburgh International Airport is approximately 19 miles from the hotel and is serviced by Air Canada, American, Delta, Jet Blue, Southwest, United, and USAir. Taxi service between the airport and the Westin is approximately \$38.00 one way, Super Shuttle fare is approximately \$30 one way, and the Port Authority's 28X Airport Flyer bus is \$3.75 one way. Rental cars may be picked up on-site at the airport. The Pittsburgh Amtrak station is located two blocks from the Westin. Amtrak's Pennsylvanian travels from New York's Penn Station via Newark and Philadelphia to Pittsburgh, while the Capitol Limited connects Washington DC to Pittsburgh, Cleveland and Chicago.

PARKING

On-site hotel valet and self-service parking is available for \$24 and \$20 per night respectively. There is also off-site parking one block away (11th & Penn) for \$13 per day and five blocks away (15th & Smallman) for \$6 per day. Prices are subject to change.

The Westin is an ADA compliant hotel offering accessible guest rooms upon request; additional questions about accessible facilities and services at the Westin should be directed to the hotel. Two pre-conference workshops will be offered. The Education and Training Committee workshop, "From Idea to Deliverable: Planning and Executing Your Grant-Funded Project," will be held in the Westin's Somerset Room from 9:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m., followed by a tour of MediaPreserve (buses will depart at 3:30 and return to the hotel at approximately 6:00 p.m.). The Technical Committee is offering the two-hour "All Hands on Deck! Audiotape Playback Workshop" which will be held at MediaPreserve (buses will depart at 12:30 and return to the hotel at approximately 4:30 p.m.).

OPENING RECEPTION

The conference will officially kick off with the opening reception on Wednesday evening in the Westin's Pennsylvania Room on the 2nd floor. Festivities begin at 7:00 p.m. and will continue until 9:00 p.m. Hors d'oeuvres, wine, beer and soda will be served, and there will be a cash bar for other drinks. Please check the box on the registration form if you plan to attend, so we can better estimate our catering needs.

NEWCOMER ORIENTATION/MENTOR PROGRAM

First-time conference attendees and conference veterans are invited to participate in the Newcomer Orientation and Mentoring Program. The program pairs newcomers with long-time members based on their shared interests. Mentors provide mentees with an orientation to the conference, the association, and its participants in informal meetings over the course of the conference. Mentors and mentees must be able to attend the newcomer orientation on Wednesday, May 27, 6:30-7:00 p.m. in the Westin's Somerset Room.
